

New England Food Foundation NEFF Cape House: A Vacation Retreat For Kids

- Managed care organizations that care for underprivileged children.
- Community-based and educational organizations that provide services for underprivileged children.
- Managed care organizations for underprivileged or abused children that are classified as day trippers. Children that spend the day at the facility and return to their home and parents each day.
- Age level of the children visitors should be 8 yrs. old up to age 16 years old.
- Organizations visiting the CAPE HOUSE must sign the NEFF Inc. Indemnification Form.
- Organizations must carry a minimum of \$1 million liability insurance. Organizations must state the liability insurance that the organization carries for personal injury, liability and property insurance in the amount of \_\_\_\_\_ on the NEFF Inc. Indemnification form.
- Organizations visiting the CAPE HOUSE must provide professionally trained and qualified in children's care and also certified lifeguards. The ratio of supervision required is one (1) supervisor for every four (4) children.
- For children swimming in Triangle Pond, it is required that there is one (1) certified lifeguard to every four (4) children in the water. Ages 8 and under, in addition to the lifeguard, there must be a staff person in the water for each two children.
- Overnight staff on duty is required.
- All staff must be CPR, First-Aid trained with current certification and CORI certified.
- Any damage to the building or property interior or exterior will be the visitors' liability to pay and will be billed for any damages including the labor to repair such damages.
- All visitors while on the property and in the CAPE HOUSE must comply with all the safety regulations posted.
